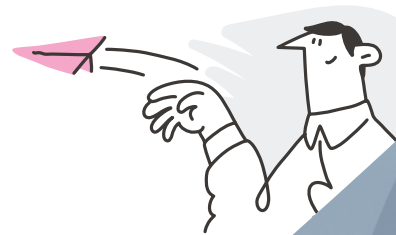

Anguilla

Visa Type:

12-month digital nomad visa.

Requirements:

- ▶ Application form.
- ▶ Passport bio data page.
- ▶ Proof of employment or business ownership.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Payment of the \$2,000 fee.

Application Portal:

Apply through the Anguilla Tourist Board's website, though the exact submission link may require navigating from the main page:

Malaysia

(DE Rantau Nomad Pass)

Visa Type:

12-month stay.

Requirements:

- ▶ Minimum annual income of RM24,000.
- ▶ RM1,000 fee.
- ▶ Proof of employment or business operation for at least two years.
- ▶ Health insurance is valid in Malaysia.

Application Portal:

The Malaysia Digital Economy Corporation (MDEC) website offers a dedicated page for application submission:

UAE

(Dubai Work Remotely Visa)

Visa Type:

12-month stay.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of employment with a one-year contract.
- ▶ Minimum \$60,000 per year income or proof of savings.
- ▶ Health insurance with UAE coverage.
- ▶ \$611 fee.

Application Portal:

Dubai's official government portal for visa applications provides a direct application process:

Mauritius (Premium Travel Visa)

Visa Type:

12-month visa.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of long-term plans for stay and sufficient travel and health insurance.
- ▶ Evidence of income or means to support themselves during the stay.
- ▶ No fee.

The Economic Development Board of Mauritius offers an online application form:

Uruguay

Visa Type:

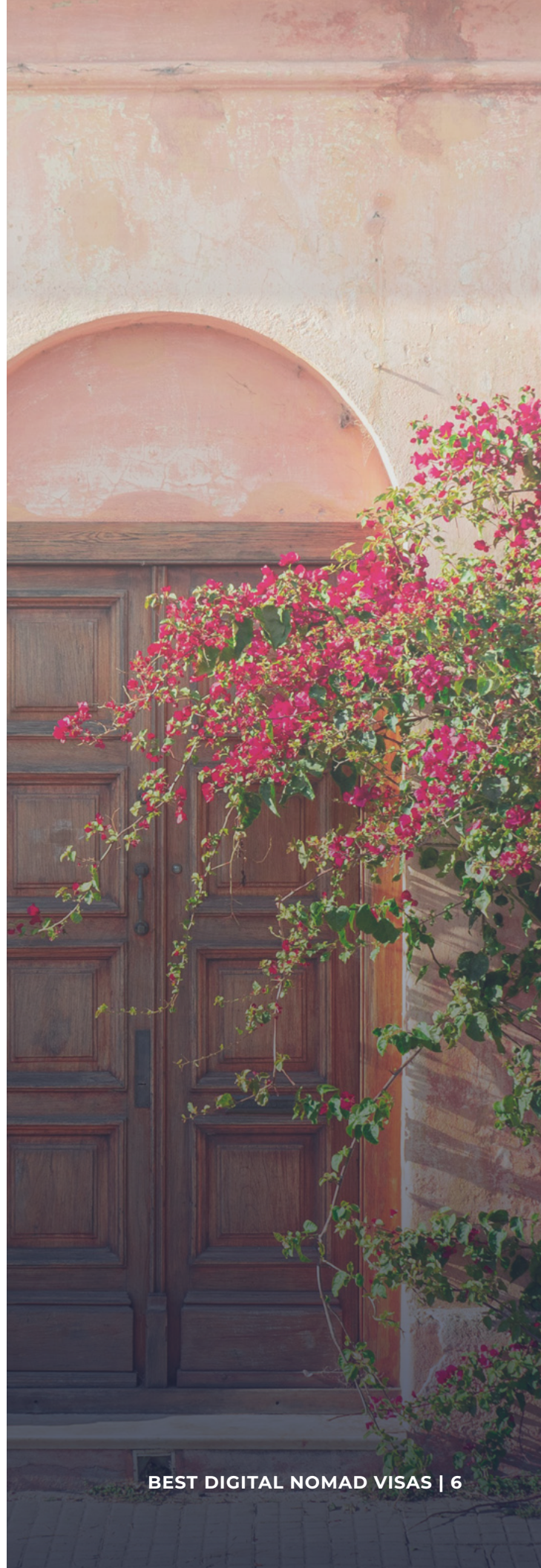
12-month digital nomad visa.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of a stable remote income.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Criminal record certificate.
- ▶ No fee is specified for the application.

Application Portal:

For detailed application instructions, Uruguay's National Immigration Office would be the starting point, though a specific online submission link may not be available.

Seychelles

(Visitors Workcation Program)

Visa Type:

12-month stay.

Requirements:

- ▶ Application form.
- ▶ Copy of passport.
- ▶ Proof of employment or business ownership.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Payment of the €450 fee.

Cyprus

Visa Type:

12-month digital nomad visa.

Requirements:

- ▶ Minimum annual income of €35,000.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Clean criminal record.
- ▶ €70 fee.

Application Portal:

The Republic of Cyprus does not offer a direct online application for the digital nomad visa; applicants should start their process by contacting the Civil Registry and Migration Department or visiting cyprusmigration.com

Spain

(International Teleworkers Visa)

Visa Type:

12-month stay, renewable.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of employment or self-employment.
- ▶ Minimum income of €2,000 per month.
- ▶ Health insurance with coverage in Spain.
- ▶ Background check.
- ▶ €80 fee.

Application Portal:

Application procedures can be initiated at the nearest Spanish consulate or embassy, with more information available on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs website:

Canada

Visa Type:

6-month digital nomad visa.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of employment or business ownership outside Canada.
- ▶ Sufficient funds to support the stay.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ \$100 fee.

Application Portal:

Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) website is the place to start, though a specific program for digital nomads may require consultation:

Italy

Visa Type:

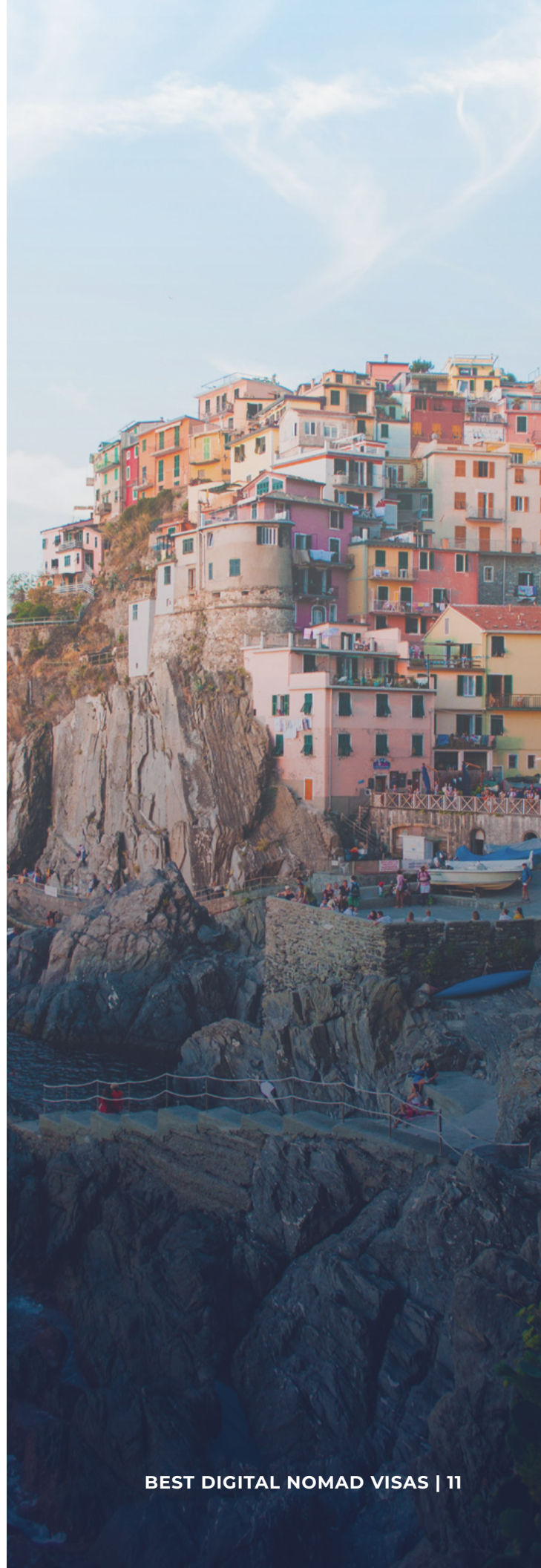
Digital nomad visa for non-EU citizens.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of a high income from stable and independent sources of income.
- ▶ Health insurance that covers risks in Italy.
- ▶ Accommodation arrangements in Italy.
- ▶ Clean criminal record.
- ▶ Sufficient evidence of the professional activity to be carried out remotely.

Application Portal:

The application must be submitted through the official Italian Visa application website or at the nearest Italian consulate/embassy in your home country. For direct links and forms: vistoperitalia.esteri.it/home/en

Greece

Visa Type:

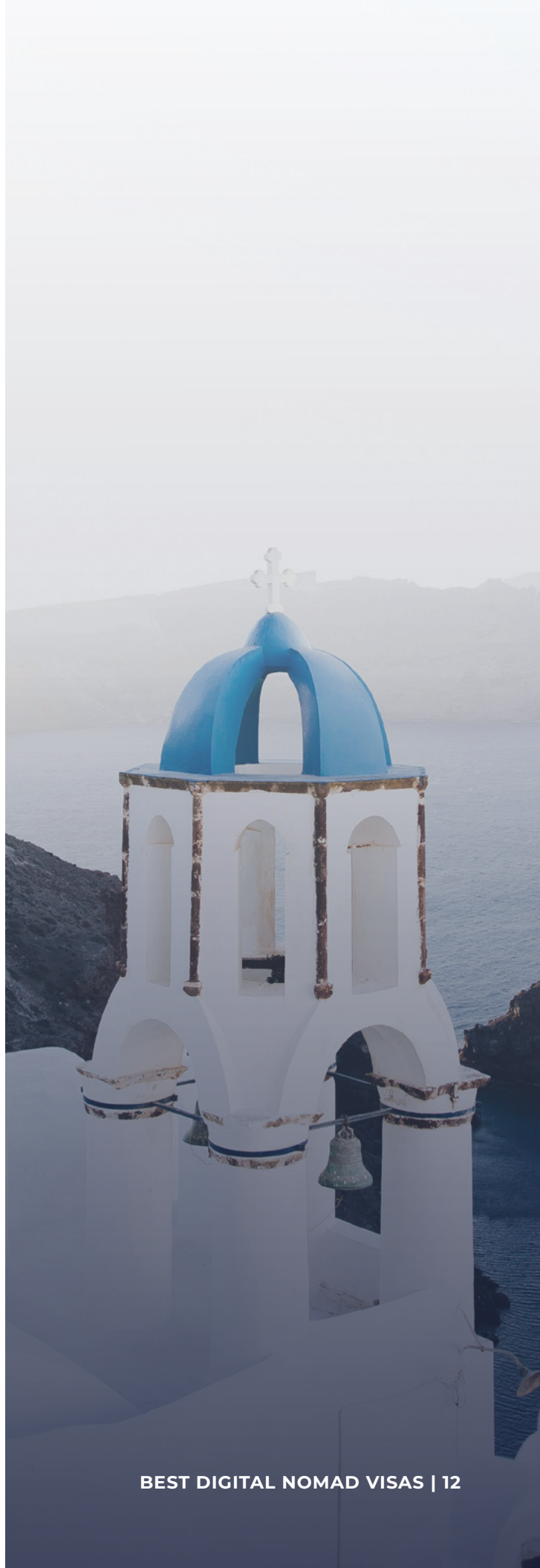
Digital nomad visa for up to a year, extendable.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of stable and sufficient income (a minimum threshold applies).
- ▶ Comprehensive health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Clean criminal record.
- ▶ Proof of remote work contract or ownership of a company.

Application Portal:

Information and application forms are available through the Greek Ministry of Foreign Affairs or the nearest Greek consulate/embassy. More details at: mfa.gr/en/visas/visas-for-foreigners-traveling-to-greece/national-visas.html

Malta

Visa Type:

Nomad residence permit,
valid for one year and renewable.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of continuous work, remotely for a non-Maltese company or as a freelancer for clients mostly outside Malta.
- ▶ Minimum monthly income of approximately €2,700.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Rental or purchase agreement in Malta.

Application Portal:

The application can be submitted through Residency Malta Agency's official website, providing detailed guidance and forms: residencymalta.gov.mt/malta-nomad-residence-permit

Mexico

Visa Type:

Temporary Resident Visa, suitable for digital nomads, valid for one year, and extendable.

Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of employment or ownership of a business.
- ▶ Financial statements proving a monthly income of at least \$1,620 over the last six months or investments/bank accounts with a minimum average balance of \$27,000 over the last twelve months.
- ▶ Health insurance with international coverage.

Application Portal:

Applications should be initiated at a Mexican consulate or embassy. More information is available at the National Institute of Migration's website: inm.gob.mx

Costa Rica

Visa Type:

Rentista Visa, valid for two years and suitable for digital nomads.

Requirements:

- ▶ Demonstrating a stable income of \$2,500 per month for at least two years, guaranteed by a banking institution, or depositing \$60,000 in a Costa Rican bank.
- ▶ Comprehensive health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Clean criminal record.

Application Portal:

The General Directorate of Migration and Immigration's official site offers details on the application process, which is typically initiated in person or via a legal representative in Costa Rica:

Though a specific URL may need to be located through a search for the Work in Nature program.

Montserrat

Visa Type:

The Montserrat Remote Work Stamp, valid for one year.

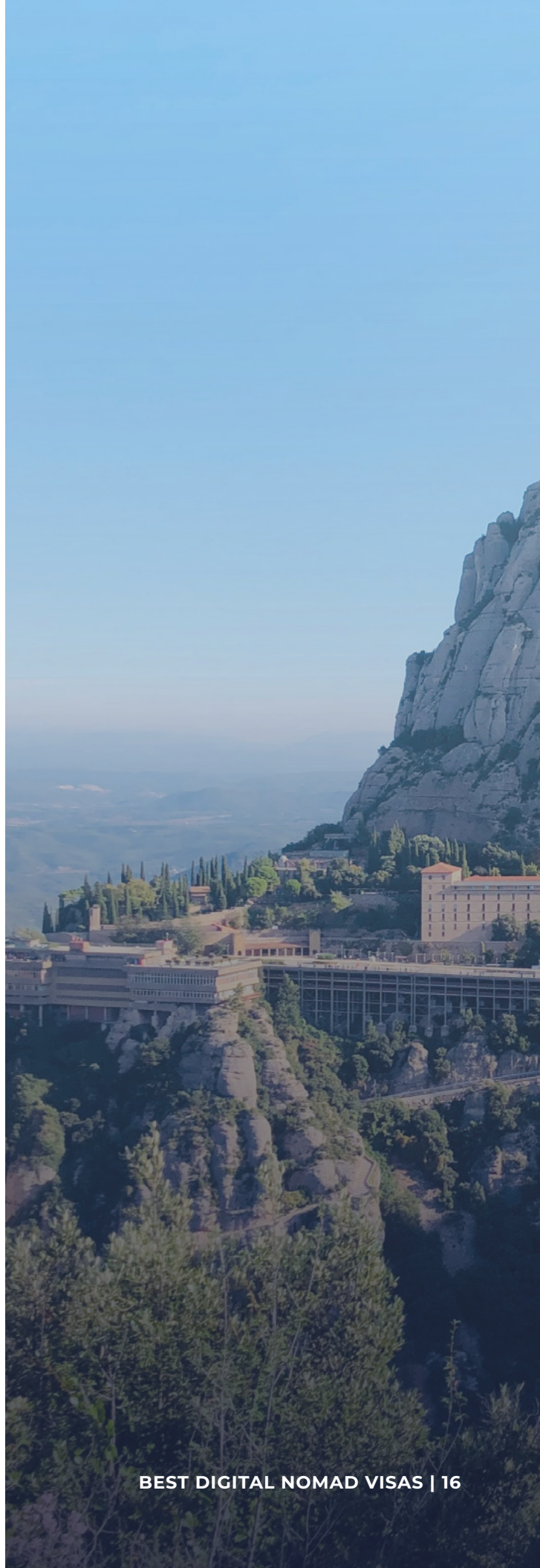
Requirements:

- ▶ Proof of employment with a minimum annual income of \$70,000.
- ▶ Health insurance coverage.
- ▶ Proof of relationship to dependents, if applying with family.
- ▶ Application fee.

Application Portal:

The application can be submitted online through Montserrat's government portal dedicated to the remote work stamp program:

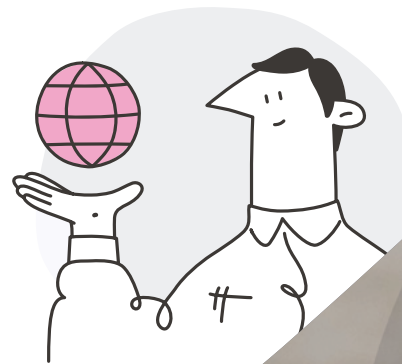
